In the mid 13th Century, the Wars of the Roses was an English civil war between the House of Lancaster and the House of York, so known due to the emblems of the two noble houses involved – the red rose of Lancaster and the white rose of York.

Today, the war continues every May, albeit in the form of a number of sporting events between the universities of York and Lancaster. In recognition to those proud of their northern roots as we here in Manchester are, we present to you Manchester Red Ale.

Manchester Red is amber in colour with toffee and subtle sweet flavours, a silky smooth taste with a lingering dry bitter finish – a beer to be remembered.

Great leaders of commerce, science and technology from Manchester, like John Dalton and Samuel Arkwright, helped make Britain a vibrant and thriving economy.

Manchester Cream Stout

- 4.3% ABV
- A traditional Manchester Cream Stout
- Brown in colour
- A creamy Irish like character with an unmistakable toast flavour and dryness.

In the mid 17th Century, a tenth of Manchester's population were housed in a district known as 'Little Ireland', the result of early immigrants from the West of Ireland looking for a better life. Unprepared for the big city they often found jobs in construction which led to them helping to create the world famous British canal system.

These Navigators (navvies) went on to work in railway and road construction. In honour of their valuable contribution to this great city and the nation, we present to you Manchester Cream Stout.

A blend of malts gives this beer its creamy Irish like character. Black malt enriches the colour and gives an unmistakable toast flavour whilst Brown malt gives it a wonderful dryness.
